

ANNOUNCEMENT

Change of Format for Reference Citations

Beginning with Volume 15, Number 1 (January, 1979), references should be listed as follows:

1. Numbered according to order of citation in the text. Appropriate number or numbers should be included in text at proper point.
2. Journal articles should list in order, last name of first author followed by initials; initials and last name of each co-author; complete title of article; abbreviated name of journal (see Chemical Abstracts List of Periodicals); volume; complete pagination; and year. Example: I. Goren, J. H., L. G. Bauce, and W. Vale. Forces and structural limitations of binding of thyrotropin-releasing factor to the thyrotropin-releasing receptor; the pyroglutamic acid moiety. *Mol. Pharmacol.* **13**:606-614, 1977.
3. Book references should list authors as above, title of article, if appropriate; title of book; editors, if appropriate, in parentheses; publisher, city of publication; year; and pages. Example: Sandler, M. Variations in monoamine oxidase activity in some human disease states, in *Monoamine Oxidase and its Inhibition*. Ciba Foundation Symposium 39. Elsevier, Amsterdam, 1976, 327-340.
